Additional Information:

BIRTH: She was born Haidée Maria Beaumont in the 3rd quarter of 1873 in London.

PARENTS: Her father was Henry Frederick Beaumont who was born in Scarborough and her mother was Maria Johanna Beaumont, nee Garforth.

MARRIAGE: At the time of Haidée's marriage she was living at Whitley Beaumont, Kirkheaton. Haidée was the wife of Kirkburton vicar William Outram. William was born in Edinburgh on 31 March 1874 – his father was Sir Francis Boyd Outram, Gentleman, and his mother was Jane Anne Outram, nee Davidson.

Haidée and William were married on 09 June 1904 at St John the Baptist Church, Kirkheaton. The occupations of both fathers on the register were given as Gentlemen.

CHILDREN: Haidée and William had three children – Eleanor Mary Outram born on 12 June 1905, Francis Henry Outram born on 02 August 1907 and James Richard Outram born on 14 Jun 1911. At the time the children were born, William was the Vicar of St George's Church, Barnsley.

DEATH: Haidée died on 27 February 1934 in Edinburgh, Scotland. Her husband William died on 09 March 1958 in Poole, Dorset.

OTHER INFORMATION: In the 1881 census, Haidée was 7 years old and living at Whitley Hall, Whitley, Kirkheaton with her parents and 7 sisters. Also living at Whitley Hall were 2 governesses and 15 servants. Her father's occupation was given as County Magistrate.

In the 1891 census, Haidee's father was a visitor at Thornes House, Wakefield which was the home of Charles George Milnes Gaskill, Member of Parliament and Barrister. On this census, her father's occupation was given as Member of Parliament. Electoral Rolls show that Henry also had a freehold house a 11 Dover Street, Ealing although his main address on the Roll was given as Whitley Hall. This would tie in with him having a property to stay at whilst he was working at the Houses of Parliament.

In the 1911 census, Haidee's father was 78 and living at Tetworth, Ascot Berkshire with his son Richard Beaumont, at 43, private secretary, daughter Octavia M Beaumont and 8 servants. It lists him as married, living on private means but his wife was not on the census.
