BIRTH: Ethel was born Julia Ethel Armitage in 1871.

PARENTS: Ethel's father was Joseph Armitage and her mother was Julia F Armitage.

MARRIAGE: Ethel married Thomas James Dyson, a solicitor of Hartley Cottage, Kirkburton on 24 July 1890. Thomas's father was George Dyson, also a solicitor and Ethel's father was Joseph Armitage, a manufacturer.

CHILDREN: Ethel and Thomas had a son, George St. John Armitage Dyson, who was born on 24 June 1893 and baptised on 24 July 1893 at All Hallows Church, Kirkburton. Their daughter, Nancy Armitage Dyson was born 19 June 1901 and she was baptised on 24 July 1901 at All Hallows Church, Kirkburton.

DEATH:

OTHER INFORMATION: Ethel and Thomas's son, George, served and returned in the First World war and his name is listed on the men's memorial board in Kirkburton Library. He rose to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel died in North Korea on 22 November 1942. He is buried in Yohama War Cemetery, Kanagawa, Japan – he had one child, Thomas Norwood Armitage Dyson.

In the 1901 census Ethel and Thomas were living at Hartley Cottage with their son George St John Armitage Dyson who was 7 years old, Ethel's aunt Catherine Raynor and servants.
