BIRTH: Maria was born on 20 October 1892 and baptised at All Hallows Church, Almondbury on 29 January 1893

PARENTS: She was the daughter of Ann Haigh, nee Shirtcliffe, and Alfred Haigh, a farmer.

Alfred and Ann married at All Hallows Church, Almondbury on 26 December 1883. Alfred's father was John Haigh, a farmer, and Ann's father was James Shirtcliffe, also a farmer.

Alfred and Ann had four children – Mary born 02 September 1886, Harry born 14 October 1888, Maria born on 20 October 1892 and George born 06 May 1894.

OTHER INFORMATION: Maria was the sister of Mary, Henry, Fred and George Haigh. Maria lived at Jenkinson Buildings, Dogley in 1911 census which were the houses after St John's Terrace and known locally as 'Tatt Row'. On this census, Maria's mother was a widow.

Maria's brothers Harry and George both served in the First World War – Harry served and returned but George served and died. Both of her brothers are listed on the Memorial Board in Kirkburton Library.
