BIRTH: Alice was born in 1864 in Inverness, Scotland.

PARENTS: Alice was the daughter of Hugh Inglis retired Colonel EI Service, and Ann Inglis, nee Arbutnot, daughter of baronet of Kingsmill House, Inverness and employed up to ten servants.

Hugh and Ann had nine children – George born 1852, William P born 1854, Ann A born 1855, Helen born 1858, Gertrude born 1859, Kathleen born 1862, John born 1862, Alice born 1864 and Georgina born 1868.

OTHER INFORMATION: Alice worked at the Kirkburton Military Hospital as a Sister alongside her sisters, Georgina and Gertrude.

In the 1901 census, Alice was working as a nurse at the St Agnes Hospital, Marylebone London. Her sister Georgina was there too at the census living on her own means.

Alice was 'specially mentioned' by the Red Cross and qualified for a war service medal on 28 February 1919.
