**BIRTH:** Gertrude was born in 1859 in Inverness, Scotland.

**PARENTS:** Gertrude was the daughter of Hugh Inglis retired Colonel EI Service, and Ann Inglis, nee Arbutnot, daughter of baronet of Kingsmill House, Inverness and employed up to ten servants.

Hugh and Ann had nine children – George born 1852, William P born 1854, Ann A born 1855, Helen born 1858, Gertrude born 1859, Kathleen born 1862, John born 1862, Alice born 1864 and Georgina born 1868.

**OTHER INFORMATION:** Gertrude was living at 4 Zoar Street, Morley in 1911 and working as a District Nurse for the Queen Victoria Jubilee Institute.

Gertrude was employed as Kirkburton Parish Nurse in about 1912 and remained the parish nurse after the war ended - electoral rolls show her living at Park View until 1927.

Gertrude was employed as Matron at the Kirkburton Military Hospital from its opening through to when it closed. Her previous service with the Red Cross was six months as acting Matron at the Broadstairs VAD Hospital.

Gertrude was 'specially mentioned' in the Red Cross records for her work at the Kirkburton Hospital.
